Saturday 25 June

[ARRL 2016 National Parks on the Air](#)

As the National Park Service (NPS) celebrates its 100th anniversary this year, radio amateurs will help mark the occasion with the ARRL National Parks on the Air (NPOTA) event [began January 1st 2016].

NPOTA will run throughout the year with activity promoted and encouraged from each of the more than 430 official NPS administrative units and affiliated areas across the US. This includes all 59 National Parks as well as National Battlefields, Historic Sites, Memorials, Preserves, Reserves, Rivers, Seashores, National Scenic Trails, and other units.

The program will have two participation tracks — Chasers and Activators. Chasers will simply attempt to make contact with operators in as many of the NPS units as possible. Activators will attempt to activate as many of the units as possible. NPOTA participants may serve in both roles. Chaser and Activator totals will be tracked via an online "Leader Board" based on LoTW data, just as was done during the ARRL Centennial QSO Party. Approval of the April 2016 Club Meeting Minutes.

Treasurer's Report. Treasurer Paul Sharp reported that since the last accounting period (summarized below) there was \$195.20 of additional income and no additional expenses bringing an "All Funds" total to date of ~\$5874. The liability insurance was recently paid and the Club Magic Jack telephone subscription was renewed for five full years resulting in a \$50-60 savings over an annual renewal term.

There are sufficient donations for purchase of the second IC-7300 HF radio and \$300.00 toward the third. The hope is to purchase the third radio by Field Day.

Ray Hitt N8VMX put forth a motion to accept the treasurer's report; Ken Gunton W8ASA offered a second to the motion. The motion passed by a vote of the membership.

Education Coordinator Report. Fred Stone states that there is nothing significant to report but announced that Fall License courses will begin September 11th.

Hospitality Coordinator Report. Tink Siwecki KD8NUA reports that Dinner and Movie night will be held on Thursday, May 26th, 7:00PM featuring "The Best of Me" with chicken and fixings for dinner. The Meeting was called to order at 7:32 by the President.

Baofeng Radios for New Members. All radios have been programmed. No new member radios are needed at this time.

Status of Deluxe 6-band U3S Kit. The Deluxe 6-band U35 kit will be done and available for demo by field day and may be used for the educational demonstration credit.

Universal Digital Radio Controller (UDRC). Russ Roysden N8NPT purchased the controller, to be used on the BARC repeater, at Hamvention®.

Sale of BARC Surplus Radios. Per Ken Gunton W8ASA the IC-718 did sell and the Kenwood 570 is currently out for repair. Eric will handle the sale of the Yaesu FT-817.

Communication Center Battery Back-up Project. Project on hold.

Status of Surplus Radios in Storage. The radios are still stored in the trailer. If the trailer is really needed for Field Day, then Fred Stone will remove them. Note: John King KA8OYH has donated his trailer to the club.

Repeater Site Gravel Bed and Generator. Project on hold.

Clubhouse Antenna Project. Fred Stone will call a meeting of Comm Center Technical Committee for further discussion and decisions on multiband HF antenna types to be installed. Fred will send out a coordination e-mail. Fred also notes the immediate priority is having sufficient antennas ready for Field Day "Plan-B" (using the Comm Center in the event of inclement weather), and also for BARC's 40th Anniversary Special Event Station July 2nd.

Fred is calling for a volunteer to direct the actual antenna work on the roof; Fred will continue as the overall project coordinator.

New Clubhouse Tool Storage. A metal carpenter's tool box has been donated but it may be too heavy except for transporting a subset of the club tools to a worksite. The original recommendation made was to purchase a two tiered rolling tool box with ball bearing drawer slides.

Sale of Surplus Antennas in Storage. The three HF beams were sold at Hamvention[®]. There are additional antennas in the coal bin to sell.

Member Antenna Needs:

- John King is requesting assistance for removal of his antenna and tower from his residence.
- A 20 to 25-foot tower is available to remove in Dayton's east-end (Watervliet Avenue).
- Jack Cotterman requests assistance in erecting an antenna at his residence.

Financial Report – Interim financial report through 01 June provided by Treasurer Paul Sharp in absentia.

Purchase of ICOM IC-7300 Radios. Three units have been purchased with a positive balance of \$170 dollars to be used to cover related expenses/accessories. Donation drive for the forth radio continues.

Little Miami River Kleeners (LMRK). Darryl has all the volunteers needed for the Little Miami River Kleeners event for Saturday June 4. Rain is forecast so please plan and dress accordingly. The event will only be canceled come high water.

Field Day Planning. There will be a Field Day planning meeting on Thursday June 9, 2016 at 7:00 pm at the Clubhouse. Eric Vinande will be handling

the main educational presentation. Bill Curtice WA8APB may hold a presentation on MESH in addition to, or as a back-up, to Eric's presentation.
