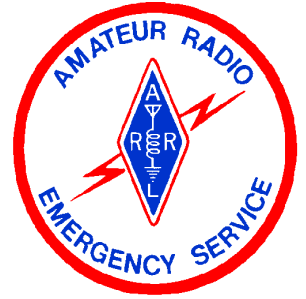

ARRL 2016 National Parks on the Air

As the National Park Service (NPS) celebrates its 100th anniversary this year, radio amateurs will help mark the occasion with the ARRL National Parks on the Air (NPOTA) event [began January 1st 2016].

NPOTA will run throughout the year with activity promoted and encouraged from each of the more than 430 official NPS administrative units and affiliated areas across the US. This includes all 59 National Parks as well as National Battlefields, Historic Sites, Memorials, Preserves, Reserves, Rivers, Seashores, National Scenic Trails, and other units.

The program will have two participation tracks — Chasers and Activators. Chasers will simply attempt to make contact with operators in as many of the NPS units as possible. Activators will attempt to activate as many of the units as possible. NPOTA participants may serve in both roles. Chaser and Activator totals will be tracked via an online “Leader Board” based on LoTW data, just as was done during the ARRL Centennial QSO Party. Approval of the May 2016 Club Meeting Minutes.

Ken Gunton W8ASA put forth the motion to approve the May 2016 meeting minutes as written. Jim Totten WA8HUB offered a second to the motion. The motion passed by a vote of the membership present.

Treasurer's Report. Treasurer Paul Sharp presented BARC's financial report for the period ending 8 July 2016.

He also noted that the fourth Icom IC-7300 HF radio was since purchased at a \$100 discount. An additional \$832.79 is still expected to be raised through a combination of donations and sale of equipment (e.g. IC-735) to cover said IC-7300 purchase. The bank balance as of this evening is ~\$3015.

Communication Center Coordinator: Eric Vinande KG8NFJ reports that the Low power WSPR beacon is connected to the 80-10m Off-Center Fed Dipole Antenna (port 3 of the Antenna Patch Panel). Check WSPRnet.org to see beacon reports for W8DGN.

Feel free to power the beacon off if the OCFD Antenna is needed for station use.

Education & Emergency Coordinator. Fred Stone W8LLY states that there is nothing significant to report.

Field Day. Chairman Darryl Fowler KD8JQE is not present to report.

Hospitality Coordinator Report. Tink Siwecki KD8NUA reports that Dinner and Movie night will be held on Thursday, July 28th at 7:00PM. Dinner and movie details TBA.

Newsletter Coordinator. Fred Stone reports that the July newsletter was sent to the membership.

Public Service Coordinator. Universal Digital Radio Controller (UDRC). The UDRC needs internet access at the repeater site to provide System Fusion and D-STAR connections to other repeaters/reflectors/chat rooms. Russ Roysden N8NPT has been running tests on it prior to installing at repeater.

QRM and Repeater Tones. We have not enabled the tone on the 440 repeater.

BARC T-Shirt Order. No Report

Sale of the IC-735. Sale pending to a BARC member

Station Equipment Ventilation and Airflow. The new IC-7300 air vents were found to be blocked by other station equipment. Members must be careful to ensure proper equipment ventilation.

Surplus Radios. Fred and Ken Cornett to address the surplus radios. Don Parker awaits their findings to in order seek the interest of Anderson Security for potential acquisition.

Clubhouse Antenna Project. Fred Stone reports that the Antenna Committee had met on the 2nd Thursday of July and will be meeting again next week. He provided a detailed status report of the antenna project at the meeting and will provide a written report to the club membership. Ken Moak discussed the multi station rotor control system to be installed. Members present agreed:

- That adding a 2nd antenna cable conduit system to the roof is necessary, appropriate and affordable.
- To changing out the Tower-1 Yaesu rotor with a CDR rotor for compatibility with respect to the Multi-Station rotor control project.
- Pull Cable for Multi-Station rotor control system.

BARC Polo Shirts. Don Parker reports that all shirt orders have been paid; will be ready at the vendor this Monday; and that he will bring them to the next General Membership meeting on Thursday.

Sale of Surplus Antennas. Henry Bussey reports that the three intact HF antennas were sold at Hamvention®. Other antennas in storage may be sold for parts; an exact inventory is needed. Chris reports that he is storing a homemade carbon fiber Quad antenna and a Beam that could be sold.

Rooftop Access Door. Nothing significant to report.

Building Door Locks. Maintenance pending by the school.

Membership Report. Paul reports that the BARC membership stands at 98 Full Members and 4 Associate Members for a total of 102 members. Paul is working to synchronize his list with Russ Roysden's membership directory database.

BARC Interim Financial Report: Paul Sharp reports the income and expenses status for current period.

Paul notes that the negative Communication Center balance is only due to the purchase of the fourth IC-7300 and accessories as we await additional income to cover the expense.

Field Day 2016. Darryl Fowler proposed that future field day events will require both a dedicated set-up crew and a dedicated tear-down crew. This is necessitated due to a shortage of help this year at the close of field day creating undue stress on the few members remaining.

Tours of Members' Radio Facilities. The idea of seeking tours of fellow members, (or other area hams') ham shacks was well received and will be considered. Other ideas include field trips to the VOA museum or area contest stations.

Bellbrook Lions Club Festival Parade. Don Parker provided a synopsis of the parade planning. Items that need attention include:

- Podium for the Reviewing Stand

Donated Speakers, Mixer and Amplifier. Possible use for the speakers is a surround sound system for Dinner and Movie Night. Sell what is not needed. Fred Stone's ceiling speaker system (baffles needed) would still be used for meetings for uniform sound distribution & to avoid microphone feedback.

Additional Equipment to Sell: Yaesu rotor when removed from rooftop tower #1.

New Hamvention® Venue. Members shared thoughts and ideas on the newly announced location at the Greene County Fairgrounds.

Kenwood TS-570D Status. Members present agreed to retain the Kenwood TS-570D as a clubhouse station radio.

Repeater Site Generator/Gravel Bed. Project currently on hold. Chris Stauter, Fred Stone and Ken Cornett to help repeater site owner to evaluate existing site generator and electrical distribution.

Training session on mobile radio installation offered by Ray Hitt. Session currently on hold.

Purchase of a Yaesu FTM400 for clubhouse System Fusion capability has been tabled indefinitely.

Clubhouse Security. It was suggested that the clubhouse security be reviewed.

New Ham Training. It was suggested that newly licensed BARC hams be offered training on 2m/70cm operations. This would be useful for their participation in public service. Consider another Ed Fong J-Pole antenna buy.

BARC Financial and Procedural Calendar. Paul noted some upcoming financial due dates (i.e. website domain name, BARC license renewals signs, ARRL VEC). 2017 Nominations Committee to be formed at the September General Membership Meeting.
