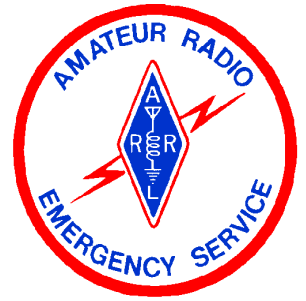

[ARES Annual S.E.T \(10/07-08\)](#)

The ARES 2017 Annual Nationwide Simulated Emergency Test (SET) will be held primarily on Saturday, October 7st, with possibly some additional regional net activities on Sunday 08 October.

The BARC will be activated as an ARES Emcomm Center to support BARC & Greene County ARES operations and as liaison between the West Central Ohio District 3 ARES regional operations and the Ohio Section ARES operations at Ohio EMA EOC.

BARC members will be needed to man the BARC Emcomm Center and also to deploy to strategic served agency sites within Bellbrook and Sugarcreek Township. 2m and 70cm voice and data modes will be used locally and across Greene County and adjacent counties. HF (80, 60 & 40m) will be used to communicate with the Ohio voice and data nets.

Plan now to participate in this important training exercise and learn more about providing auxiliary communication support for served agencies in the event of disaster or communication emergency.

The 2017 annual Bellbrook Fire Department Open House will be held on Tuesday, October 10th, from 6:00 to 9:00 PM, at Station 22, 4254 West Franklin Street (northwest corner West Franklin St & North Linda Dr). Call to Order. Sr. Director Jim Totten called the meeting to order at 7:30 PM and opened with the US Pledge of Allegiance. (President Chris Stauter join the meeting later in the evening)

Introductions: Members and guests introduced themselves.

Meeting Program. Photo Review of BARC's 2017 Field Day. Don Parker KB8PSL and Darryl Fowler KD8JQE

Approval of Club Meeting Minutes. Ken Gunton W8ASA put forth the motion to approve the July 2017 General Membership Meeting minutes as written. Gregg Goffe N8DRG offered a second to the motion. The motion passed by a vote of the membership present.

Lions Club Festival Parade. Member Dave Walton KD8GCR wishes to offer a round of applause for the Parade Crew efforts.

Hospitality Coordinator: Tink Siwecki KD8NUA reports that **BARC Dinner and Movie night** will be held on August 31st. The movie "Princess Bride" will be presented following a pasta dinner.

BARC Financial Report. Treasurer Paul Sharp was not present to report but provided the following

financial summary in writing for the prior period ending 10 August 2017:

The major expenses for this period are the BARC website fees and Ohio BMV registration fees for the trailer.

Approval of the Treasurer's Report. Gregg Goffe N8DRG put forth the motion to approve the Treasurer's report as presented. Ken Gunton W8ASA offered a second to the motion. The motion passed by a vote of the membership present.

Historic WWI Commemorative event in Oudenaarde Belgium. Robert French KE8HF1 announced an opportunity for BARC's participation in Amateur Radio Special Event related to a Historic WWI Commemorative event in Oudenaarde Belgium with a special Ohio connection. Robert reports the following:

Next year some radio amateurs from Belgium would like to communicate via Ham Radio with BARC operators for a special historic event.

This is a commemoration of the events in Oudenaarde Belgium in October 1917 of Sgt Smithiesler (Ohio) and Pvt. Frank Burke's (Ohio) heroic activities which ultimately pushed the Germans out of Belgium, days before the armistice was signed. The commemoration celebrates this Ohio/Belgium connection.

My contact for this event is retired Belgium Army Signal Corps Colonel Chris Dewaele. He emailed me today regarding next year's amateur radio part of the event. Thus far, the only thing that is fixed is radio emission from 10AM to 1PM Sunday, May 27, 2018 (ed note-Dayton/Belgium local or UTC?). The Ham part of the event is between the USA (BARC), Belgium, UK, Germany, and possibly France.

Colonel Dewaele is most interested in BARC's participation because Smitheisler and Burke, the heroes who are the focus of the commemoration, were from Ohio.

I told Colonel Dewaele that I would have someone from BARC contact him to advise him whether or not BARC would participate in the event. If yes, BARC would communicate directly with him via email to follow the plans as they unfolded (I will be in Belgium for the event).

Colonel Dewaele promised a lot of media coverage for BARC in Belgium. I see a strong possibility here for articles on BARC's role in such an event in QST magazine and various Ohio newspapers and magazines.

Robert also presented a short video excerpt for the membership.

The BARC membership is interested in participating and will discuss logistics at the next meeting of the Planning Group.

The Meeting was called to order at 7:31 by the President.

Ohio State Parks on the Air (OSPOTA). OSPOTA will take place on Saturday, 9 September at the John Bryan State Park campsite picnic shelter. Antennas will be erected on Friday evening – helpers to arrive at 6:30 PM. Contest start time on Saturday is earlier this year. Operators to arrive at 7:00 AM for preparation; 9:00 for operational briefing; with contest starting at 10:00 AM and running through 6:00 PM. Gregg will provide breakfast and Tink will provide lunch.

Station Hardware Integration. Ken Moak reports: Another round of work on the clubhouse station will begin after OSPOTA:

- Coax connectors and jumpers need to be checked and fixed.
- Wiring behind the radios need to be extended for greater slack when pulling radios and accessories out of their slots for maintenance etc.
- Consider purchasing smaller switching power supplies for use at remote events and leave the heavier linear supplies in the stations.
- Upgrade/repair Field Day antennas.

Roof Antennas: The status/timeline for placement of the gravel on the roof by the school needs to be determined. Upcoming events such as the SET in October will require that the antenna projects be completed ASAP. Ken Moak notes that club funds well spent on station HF radio and antenna upgrades has improved contest participation and scores.

General Membership Meeting Program Topics: Ken Moak reports the following upcoming meeting programs:

- September: MESH and Winlink (Bill Curtice and Fred Stone)
- October: Chili Dinner

- November: ICOM 7300 Operations (Ken Gunton)

Some newly licensed ham members expressed interest in introductory level program topics for future BARC meetings.

Repeater hardline. The WCOARA/BARC joint repeater project will proceed as discussed in July; Fred Stone reiterated the plan. The options for hardline were discussed. WCOARA is willing to provide 1/2" hardline. This hardline is to be used at the clubhouse but 7/8" hardline still will be purchased for the longer run at the repeater site. Ken Moak will continue to pursue price and shipping for 7/8" hardline to piggy back on his personal hardline order. Appropriate connectors will also be purchased. The repeater site owner will handle installation of new antennas and new hardline as well as a planned MESH node antenna.

QSL Coordinator. Eric will serve as interim QSL coordinator.

Repeater Status. Russ Roysden reports that the repeater itself is working fine. The interference continues intermittently due to external causes. The 440 MHz repeater upgrade is complete and functioning.

Clubhouse Emergency Lighting. Fred Stone reports the project is pending.

Six-meter Repeater. A triband antenna and triplexer is needed.

Bellbrook Fire Department Open House. Fred Stone reports that this annual open house will be held on Tuesday 10 October. Jim Lusk, Chris Stauter and Fred will participate. All club members are welcome to attend this annual event. This is good PR for the club. Further details via BARC Reflector.

ICOM 7300 Training. The November 2017 meeting program will discuss these radios.

2017 Ohio QSO Party Results. See Ken Gunton's reflector e-mail.

Surplus Equipment Disposal. Ken Gunton needs assistance in re-inventorying the equipment in the trailer. Fred will locate the original list and forward it to Ken.

Lions Club Festival Parade. The parade took place on 17 August and it went well. The Spring Valley antique fire truck had difficulty starting at parade time but the resultant order change in the lineup was communicated to the reviewing stand.

An idea of using a cross band repeater for improved net control to reviewing stand communication was put forth. However, Gregg Goffe reported that the

perceived issue was really a weak radio battery. After the battery was replaced, the issue was resolved and communications with the reviewing stand stabilized.

Rohn Tower Donation. A Rohn tower, rotor and antenna was donated to BARC by BARC member Rod Brown WD8EII. BARC must handle the tower removal from the Rod's residence. Henry Bussey will lead the project. Chris Stauter, Paul Sharp, and Ken Moak have volunteered to help.

Treasure's Report: Since the August report, subsequent expenses and income (e.g. OSPOTA and Amazon Smile) yield a current bank balance of approximately \$3300.

Historic WWI Commemorative event in Oudenaarde Belgium. Ken Gunton will coordinate the associated amateur radio special event with the contact in Belgium. The event is to take place in May of 2018. See the August general membership meeting minutes for details.

Nominations Committee. The Nominations Committee for the election of the 2018 BARC officers and Members-at-Large is due to be formed at the September General Membership Meeting.

Adjournment. The president adjourned the meeting at 8:48 PM.
