Beavercreek 33rd Annual New Year's Eve 5K Resolution Run (12/31)

Plan now to participate in the ham radio support for the 33rd Annual Beavercreek 5-K Resolution Run New Year's Eve. 30-plus operators are needed to provide safety and logistics communications and help light the course with their vehicle headlights during the race.

The start and finish are at Beavercreek High School and the course winds through the neighborhood to the North of the school. We provide safety support and course logistics. The streets used by the course are not equipped with lighting, so we provide some sing our vehicle headlights. We also place several generator lights out on the course. We need a few volunteers to help tow the lights out before the event and to return them to the school afterward. The lights are not too heavy and can be towed by almost any vehicle equipped with a 2 inch ball. (contact n8ado@arri.net if you can help tow lights).

It is traditional to have punch and a snack buffet before the event, so come out early and bring a snack to share.

If you can help with course coverage, come to the DARA Truck behind the school by 7:00 PM for an assignment. The run is a 5k, so expect it to take about an hour from the starting gun at 8:00 PM. Contact n8ado@arri.net if you would like a particular advance assignment or if you have questions.

[BARC 2019 Dues Now Payable](#)

BARC Treasurer Paul Sharp KD8OPN has announced that he now is accepting dues for 2019.

Most BARC memberships expire December 31, 2018—including new hams licensed in 2018 who paid 2018 dues and received free HT Transceiver.

- Annual membership renewal is \$15 per member and \$3 for each additional family member living at the same address.
- New members joining BARC in November or December 2018 pay \$15 which includes 2019 dues good through December 31, 2019.

The Free Memberships for hams newly licensed in 2018 expire 12 months from the end of the month first licensed. Free memberships for new hams licensed in November or December 2018 are good through December 31, 2019.

- BARC members first licensed in 2018 who elected free membership will be notified by the Treasurer of their free membership expiration date. Such

members will pay a pro-rated amount of dues for the remainder of the 2019 membership year.

2018 memberships become delinquent if not renewed by the February 2019 meeting. The 2019 Membership Directory will include all members who have renewed or joined by 1 March 2019.

Dues help support Club activities such as the BARC Clubhouse, Communications Center, the Repeaters, Field Day expenses and other purchases and activities as approved by the Club during the year.

Call to Order. The President called the meeting to order at 7:30 pm and opened with the US Pledge of Allegiance.

Members and Guests Introduced Themselves. The president recognized three newly licensed amateur radio operators.

Approval of Club Meeting Minutes. James Lusk KC8EDF put forth the motion to approve the September 2018 General Membership Meeting minutes as written. Lynn Rogers KE8FLL offered a second to the motion. The motion passed by a vote of the membership in attendance.

(Note: No business was conducted at the October 2018 Annual Chili Dinner Meeting; hence no minutes to approve)

BARC Financial Report. In round numbers, an “all funds” beginning balance of \$6870; \$106 of income; no expenses and an ending “all funds” balance of \$6890 was reported for the BARC financial period ending in November. An expense of \$425 for new Bellbrook city limit BARC signs was incurred in the current financial period.

The Meeting was called to order at 7:32 by the President.

BARC Meeting Teleconferencing. Jim Wilder and John Westerkamp discussed the teleconferencing capability for BARC and all of its features and attributes. He also listed some proposed rules of engagement. Jim is offering the use of his personal teleconferencing service account, and any hardware needed. Jim and John proposed that the service availability and instructions for access be widely publicized via the reflector and newsletter. They assure the club that the teleconference moderator can accept, reject or disconnect any virtual attendee. John’s account should have more than enough capacity (100 simultaneous users) but it could always be expanded if necessary. The Planning Group generally agrees to opening the meeting via teleconference to both members and guests.

BARC Signage on Clubhouse Door. In a prior meeting the planning group has approved a plan to place a sign on the hallway door identifying the club with emergency contact numbers of the Clubhouse

Coordinator, the President and the Vice President. Jim Lusk was tasked with this item but is not present to report on its status.

BARC Community Marquee Signs. Fred Stone reports that the new signs are in-hand. The Bellbrook Lions Club is responsible for the Bellbrook city limit sign boards and will install them at the four city limit locations when the weather permits. The timing of this action is no longer under BARC's control.

Member Elmering. Jeff Markland is seeking an Elmer from the club. Paul Sharp will follow-up with Jeff. A point person is needed for members seeking technical assistance. A logical forum for seeking assistance or finding an elmer is BARC's Tech-Night.

Education Coordination. Fred Stone announced his resignation as Education Coordinator. He will gladly help a new volunteer establish his/her role and assist as needed.

Clarification of Free Radio Policy for New Hams. BARC currently offers newly licensed hams joining the club their choice either a complementary one-year BARC membership or a free HT per individual. Any individual choosing the free HT shall pay full rate individual membership dues for the first year. Thereafter, the family membership rates shall apply accordingly.

Deputy Treasurer Position. Henry Bussey W8TOG will be stepping down from the deputy treasurer position. James Gifford KD8APT has volunteered to assume this role. The planning group consents to this appointment. He will be confirmed by a vote of the membership in December.

Substitute/Back-up Net Controllers Needed. Jim Wilder has volunteered to be a back-up net controller.

2019 BARC Goals and Objectives.

1. Repeater issues.

Noise: Roger Parrett attempted to analyze the issue this past Sunday but the repeater behaved well. Paul proposed a program management approach which he wrote up and sent to the parties involved. Russ will take the lead with John Westerkamp's help.

Hardline Installation: Russ is meeting soon with the very busy repeater site owner to discuss hardline and antenna installation this spring.

2. Rooftop Antenna Project Completion.

- Need to identify location and install EmComm UHF/VHF antenna. Ken Moak is working with Lynn on the mounting hardware;
- Consider installation of desired 30-m antenna;

- An Antenna Coordinator is needed. Ken could become involved, but he has other priorities.
- Ken will write a report on the project status including potential plans and options.

3. Refurbish the Vertical antenna. This is a tech-night project. The antenna is large, but subassemblies can be installed and the antenna refurbished indoors during the cold weather.

4. IRLP and EchoLink. Paul will contact Eric Vinande concerning the status.

5. Feedline for Presentations and Demos. The installation of two coax cables from the Antenna Patch Panel (Ports #46 & #47) will begin during the upcoming Tech-Night. This will allow easy access to any two antennas for presentations, demonstrations and training.

6. Excess Equipment Cluttering the Clubhouse. Ken Gunton will hold an auction at the upcoming meeting. Any items remaining may be donated or disposed of in the trash.

7. Half-inch Hardline for Clubhouse Use. The hardline is currently located at repeater site and it need to be brought to the clubhouse. This item belongs under #2 above.

8. Seven-eighths-inch hardline for Repeater Use. The spool needs to be transported to the repeater site. Installation dependent on repeater site owner availability per item #1. Paul will contact Chris Stauter to arrange transport. Russ will ask if it can be stored at the repeater site.

9. Continue Tech-Night. Yes. A member present was disappointed that it conflicts with DARA's Tech-Night time slot.

10. Support JOTA in 2019. Yes

11. John King's Tower Removal. This still needs to be done. Additional BARC tower climbers are needed.

12. Third Party Antenna/Tower Removal. No longer applicable.

13. Russ Roysden's Tower Parts. Russ is donating the tower pieces to BARC. It is not erected and available for the club to sell. Fred will advertise on the various e-mail lists.

14. Six-meter Repeater. This repeater was donated to the club by Russ. It could have been donated to GCARES. In either case: 1) Russ would oversee the installation and, 2) the timing of the installation is dependent on the repeater site owner's availability to climb the tower. The same is true of BARC's overall repeater improvement project. Thus, both projects would, necessarily, be resolved simultaneously.

However, some have expressed frustration that the 6-m repeater project has been on the BARC task list for a while, and that it would eventually become BARC's responsibility to maintain and service. After some discussion, Russ felt it best to withdraw the 6-m repeater donation from BARC and instead donate it to GCARES.

15. Communication Center Improvements. Jim Totten re-introduced the idea of purchasing a 10-15-20-meter triplexer in order to operate three radios on three different bands on one antenna. The overall costs, including better filters and receiver protection, may be high versus the benefit for station use. However, a triplexer system may simplify the Field Day antenna array.

BARC International Ambassador for Contesting. Emerio has offered to serve in this capacity to aid in translations during contesting.

BARC Website. Bob French will add a Tech-Night Page to the website. He also has fixed some recent website bugs. Bob is doing a great job on the website.

New Clubhouse Clock. The new clubhouse clock fell off of the wall and shattered. Tink will handle replacing the clock.

Adjournment. The secretary adjourned the meeting at 9:08 PM.
